
CRITICAL CARE NURSING REVIEW (September 1, 2022 to May 31, 2023)

The Critical Care Review includes:

- Course topics organized into 9 Modules (one module per month).
- Self-directed and self-paced access. A study plan that aligns with the recommended time frames is recommended.
- Course material for Module 1 will be available September 1, 2022.
- All instruction and course material will be developed and provided by Brenda Morgan.
- Course material is accessed through a password protected website.
- Videos and course materials will be accessible to participants until July 31, 2023.
- Participants will have access to the instructor by email and can arrange for individual telephone or ZOOM support if needed.
- Continuing Learning activity hours will be provided at the end of the course.
- Payment is by eTransfer (preferred) or cheque only. Contact critcareconcepts@rogers.com if cheque payment is desired.

Several topics are covered within each of the self-directed modules. Registration fee includes:

- 1. **Video presentations:** Some, but not all of the presentations will include a note-taking guide. Use is optional, but is available for individuals who like to make notes that follow the presentation.
- 2. **Handouts:** Handouts are discussion papers/overviews that review content also included in the videos. These are available to complement or reinforce information presented in the videos.
- 3. **Self-assessment tools:** These are short practice quizzes that participants can use to assess their own knowledge of content covered in that module (before or after using the video). Answers are provided.
- 4. Guidelines or Practice Guidelines: Guidelines specific to topics covered are included for added reading if interested.
- 5. Additional Links: Links to related sites for added optional education.
- 6. **Optional Live Class:** At the end of each module, two optional live classes will be offered by ZOOM. Clinical scenarios and cases will be used to examine and apply content covered during that module. Each class will include different content and be offered once in the live format. A recorded version of each class will be available for a period of 14 days. All other course material will be remain available to participants until July 31, 2023



ABOUT THE COURSE

This course provides an overview and expands upon the core critical care theory and competencies that provide the basis for the certification examination in adult critical care nursing in Canada (CNCC-C). This course is of benefit to nurses working in critical care who are seeking a core review, with to enhance their baseline knowledge, or preparing to become certified (or recertified) in adult critical care nursing. This course is a review; content is geared to individuals with prior or current critical care experience. Nurses without critical care experience who are motivated to learn are always welcome. Course content builds upon the in-classroom review previously offered by this instructor; the curriculum has been expanded and adapted to facilitate remote learning.

HOW THE COURSE IS PROVIDED

This course is available only to registered participants. Content is organized into modules and presented through password protected pre-recorded videos and handout material. At the conclusion of each module, 2 follow-up class will be provided (by ZOOM on scheduled dates). The purpose of the follow-up class is to reinforce module content and apply learnings to clinical scenarios. Participation in the live class is recommended to get the greatest benefit from the course. Each class will only be offered once but a recorded version will be available to participants for a period of two-weeks. All other course material will remain accessible until June 30, 2023.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Participants require a computer with audio and video capabilities. All correspondence will be via email.

CONTINUOUS LEARNING HOURS

Participants will receive Continuous Learning activity hours at completion of the course that can be used by certified nurses toward recertification of their CNCC(C).

HANDOUTS

Registered participants will be provided with password protected links to access all course material.

A former President of the Canadian Association of Critical Care Nurses (CACCN), she has chaired or been a planning committee member for 5 of CACCN's national conventions. She continues to support CACCN activities at a national and local level. A previous item-writer and past member of the Canadian Nurses Association CNCC(C) examination committee, Brenda is the author of the certification study guide that is available to CACCN members.
